Awards Banquet & Program Acknowledges Safety Records

Companies and organizations of all sizes and industry types will be recognized in four separate categories at the Lake County Safety Council awards luncheon.

Thirty companies will be saluted for their level of safety improvement. This award notes companies or organizations that reduced their accident rate by 25 percent or more over the previous years.

Twenty companies will be given special awards for accumulating at least 500,00 hours and at least six (6) months without an injury resulting in a day away from work. More than 110 companies will receive the 100 percent award for working the entire year without an injury resulting in a day away from work.

And 31 companies will be recognized as multiple award winners, including 10 companies or organizations that will receive awards for having the lowest incident rate in their industry group. Nine organizations...Polychem Corporation, Transfer Express, STERIS Corp., CT Consultants, ESCO TT Cleveland, Lake County Dept. of Utilities, Willo Security, Gateway Retirement Community and Avery Dennison will receive three awards.

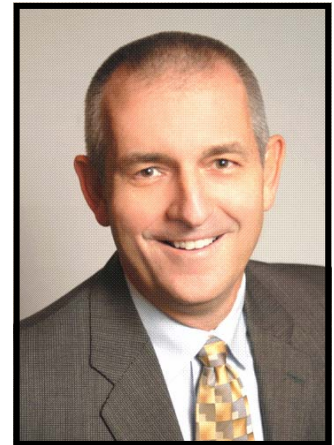
